

DMHC Task Force on Pharmacy Benefit Management Reporting Solicitation for Members

The Department of Managed Health Care (DMHC) is seeking dynamic and solutionoriented healthcare professionals and advocates to serve on the legislatively mandated DMHC Task Force on Pharmacy Benefit Management Reporting. As part of Assembly Bill (AB) 315 (Wood, Chapter 905, Statutes of 2018), the DMHC must convene the Task Force in collaboration with:

- Other agencies and departments
- Advocates and experts
- Health care service plan representatives
- Other entities and stakeholders the DMHC deems appropriate

The Task Force will meet at least once a month from June 2019 to December 2019 to determine what information related to pharmaceutical costs, if any, DMHC should require to be reported by health care service plans or their contracted Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBM). The DMHC is required to submit a report with the Task Force's findings and recommendations to specified persons and entities within the Legislature by February 1, 2020.

The most-qualified candidates will have training and experience in one or more of the following areas:

- Medical and health care economics
- Pharmacy practice and laws and regulations
- Management and administration in integrated or affiliated health care delivery systems
- Prescription drug regulation and distribution
- Accountancy, with experience in integrated or affiliated health care delivery systems
- Actuarial studies in the area of health care delivery systems or other related field
