**SUBJECT:** Oroville Dam State of Emergency and Evacuations

On February 12, 2017, California Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. proclaimed a state of emergency in the Counties of Butte, Sutter, and Yuba due to the potential significant flooding below the Oroville Dam. This potential flooding prompted the ordered evacuation of over one hundred thousand of residents in the identified counties.

Health care service plans are advised to ensure that their enrollees who may have been displaced by the evacuation have continued appropriate access to the health care services those enrollees need. This may require plans to relax temporarily certain requirements including, but not limited to:

- Relaxing time limits for prior authorization, pre-certification, or referrals.
- Suspending prescription refill limitations and permitting impacted enrollees to refill their prescriptions at out-of-network pharmacies.
- Allowing replacement of medical equipment or supplies.
- Extending filing deadlines for claims.
