SUBJECT: APL 23-009 - Health Plan Coverage of Preventive Services

This morning the district court judge in *Braidwood Management Inc., et al, v. Becerra, et al.*² issued a nationwide injunction barring the United States Department of Health and Human Services from enforcing the preventive care mandates in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA). The California Department of Managed Health Care (DMHC) anticipates that the defendants in that action will appeal the decision.

However, regardless of whether the defendants appeal and the outcome of any such appeal, the *Braidwood Management Inc.* decision will not impact enrollees in health plans regulated by the DMHC, because the Knox-Keene Health Care Service Plan Act (Knox-Keene Act) imposes an independent duty on health plans to cover the preventive services effected by the ruling. Additionally, health plans must cover these services without costsharing or prior authorization.³

This duty is not tied to the ACA's requirements regarding coverage of preventive services. Preventive services health plans must cover under the Knox-Keene Act include, but are not limited to:

• Evidence-based items or services that have in effect a rating of "A" or "B" in the recommendations of the United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF), as periodically updated. These services include, but are not limited to, screenings for certain cancers and sexually transmitted diseases, behavioral health screenings, and diabetes screenings.⁴

- Immunizations that have in effect a recommendation, as periodically updated, from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention with respect to the individual involved.⁵
- With respect to women, infants, children, and adolescents, evidence-informed preventive care and screenings provided in the comprehensive guidelines, as periodically updated, supported by the United States Health Resources and Services Administration.⁶
- Preexposure and postexposure HIV prophylaxis drugs (e.g., PrEP), without prior authorization or costsharing.⁷
- FDA approved contraceptive drugs and devices without any costsharing.⁸
