- **SUBJECT:** All Plan Letter (APL) 23-022 Compliance with Senate Bill 1419 (2022) Health Information

On September 30, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Senate Bill (SB) 1419, which added Section 1374.196 to the Knox-Keene Health Care Service Plan Act of 1975, as amended<sup>1</sup>. Section 1374.196 requires health care service plans, on or after January 1, 2024, to establish and maintain application programing interfaces (API) for the benefit of enrollees and contracted providers to facilitate patient and provider access to health information as applicable under federal rules. These APIs are to be in accordance with standards published in a final rule issued by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and published in the Federal Register, and align with federal effective dates, including enforcement delays and suspensions.

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 1343, subdivision (b), the Director is authorized to exempt health plans from compliance with sections of the Act, if the Director finds the action to be in the public interest and not detrimental to the protection of enrollees. Given the pending federal guidance related to APIs, the Director exempts health plans from compliance with the January 1, 2024, effective date in Section 1374.196, and extends the effective date to January 1, 2025.
