Agenda Item 1 – Welcome and Introductions

Sarah Brooks, Project Director, called the meeting to order, conducted a roll call, gave an overview of the third Committee meeting, walked through the agenda, meeting materials, and Committee timeline. Alex Kanemaru, Project Manager, reviewed housekeeping notes for in-person and virtual Committee members and members of the public.

Agenda Item 2 – Review of the April 20, 2022 Meeting Summary (Transcript, P. 12-13)

Agenda Item 3 – Continued Discussion: Data Quality Expert Panel (Transcript, P. 13-17)

Ms. Brooks gave a recap of the March 24 and April 20, 2022, Data Quality Expert Panels, introduced Kristine Toppe from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) and Dr. Anna Lee Amarnath from Integrated Healthcare Association (IHA), and provided an opportunity for the Committee to continue the discussion from the previous meetings.

Agenda Item 4 – Discussion on Measures and Disparities by Focus Area (Transcript, P. 18-65)

Ms. Brooks outlined the goal and audience for the measures selected, the process for measure selection, guiding principles, focus areas, and how the measures for the Committee's review and discussion were identified. Ignatius Bau, Health Equity SME, and Dr. Andy Baskin, MD, Quality SME provided overviews of the prevention, chronic conditions, and mental health focus areas, including disparities for the mental health focus area.

After a robust discussion, the Committee recommended the measures below for each focus area.

Prevention Focus Area:

- Cervical Cancer Screening
- Colorectal Cancer Screening
- Breast Cancer Screening

Chronic Condition Focus Area:

- Hemoglobin A1c Control for Patients with Diabetes
- Controlling High Blood Pressure
- Asthma Medication Ratio

Mental Health Focus Area:

- Depression Screening and Follow-Up for Adolescents and Adults
- Follow-Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness
- Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness

Agenda Item 6 – Continued Discussion: Measures and Disparities by Focus Area (Transcript, P. 66-121)

Mr. Bau and Dr. Baskin provided overviews of disparities and measures for the substance use, birthing persons and children, and access focus areas, respectively. The Committee recommended the measures below for the substance use, birthing persons and children, and access focus areas.

Substance Use Focus Area:

- Pharmacotherapy for Opioid Use Disorder
- Unhealthy Alcohol Use Screening and Follow-up

Birthing Persons and Children Focus Area:

- Cesarean Rate for Nulliparous Singleton Vertex
- Prenatal and Postpartum Care
- Contraceptive Care All Women Ages 15–44
- Childhood Immunization Status (Combo 10)
- Weight Assessment and Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for Children/Adolescents
- Topical Fluoride Varnish for Children
- Well-Child Visits in the First 30 Months of Life (W30)
- Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits

Access Focus Area:

It was determined that while access is a critical component of receiving high
quality and equitable health care, there are no measures in the access focus
area that should be considered in the recommended list of measures. Rather
access measures show up in other focus areas. The final report will include
language outlining the importance of access.
